<p><b>Aug 9</b> <b>6:00-9:00</b></p> <p><b>Ballard Hill</b></p>	<p><b>Cross-Bow Certification</b></p>	<p>To be eligible to purchase a crossbow hunting license, any person (16 years of age and older) must hold a valid license to hunt big game (either a big game hunting license or an archery license), and must submit proof of having successfully completed an archery hunting education course <b>and</b> a crossbow hunting course <b>or</b> evidence of having previously held adult archery <b>and</b> crossbow hunting licenses issued specifically for the purpose of hunting with a crossbow or bow and arrow in this State or any other state, province or country in any year after 1979. When proof or evidence cannot be provided, the applicant may substitute a signed affidavit.</p>	<p><b>\$5.00</b></p>

<p><b>Aug 11 6:00-9:00</b></p> <p><b>Ballard Hill</b></p>	<p><b>Trapping Course</b></p>	<p>A trapper education course teaches participants how to responsibly trap furbearing animals and provides a foundation of knowledge upon which to build. Topics in the 10 hour course include proper trapping equipment and use, responsible trap setting, the importance of good wildlife management practices, and habits and traits of furbearers. Students must pass a written exam. Home study requires attendance at all sessions as well as study at home, in order to receive your certificate.</p>	<p><b>\$5.00*</b></p>
